

3. The General Counsel and Charging Party argue that they should be allowed an extension because of the Thanksgiving holiday, but such an extension would require Respondent to work through Christmas and make Respondent's reply brief due on New Years' Eve.

4. Based on the foregoing, the General Counsel and Charging Party's Joint Motion for Extension of Time to File Answering Briefs should be denied.

5. In the alternative, if the Board determines that the number of exceptions filed by Respondent warrant a fourteen (14) day extension to file answering briefs, Respondent should be granted a fourteen (14) day extension to file its reply, up to and including January 14, 2007.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Respondent respectfully requests that the General Counsel and Charging Party's Joint Motion for Extension of Time to File Answering Briefs be denied. In the alternative, Respondent respectfully requests the Board grant it a fourteen (14) day extension to file its reply, up to and including January 14, 2007.
