COUNSEL FOR THE GENERAL COUNSEL'S  
REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE  
ANSWERING BRIEF TO RESPONDENT'S EXCEPTIONS AND  
REQUEST TO EXCEED THE PAGE LIMIT FOR ANSWERING BRIEF TO EXCEPTIONS

Pursuant to Section 102.46(d)(3) of the Board's Rules and Regulations, and for the reasons set forth below, Counsel for the General Counsel respectfully requests an extension of time to file an answering brief to the Exceptions submitted by Respondent to the decision of Administrative Law Judge McCarrick in the above-captioned cases. Pursuant to Section 102.46(d)(1), Counsel for General Counsel's answering brief to Respondent's Exceptions is currently due on May 19, 2008.

Exceptions in this matter were initially due on April 3, 2008. On March 21, 2008, Respondent was granted an extension of time for the filing of exceptions, up to May 5, 2008. Respondent has filed 237 Exceptions to the ALJ's decision. Respondent's Brief in Support of the Exceptions is 100 pages long. Counsel for the General Counsel did not receive Respondent's Exceptions until the afternoon of May 7, 2008.

In light of Respondent's numerous Exceptions and extensive Brief in Support of the Exceptions, as well as other deadlines scheduled in the near future in other cases assigned to Counsel for General Counsel, Counsel for General Counsel respectfully requests an extension of time in which to file an answering brief to Respondent's Exceptions up to and including Friday, June 20, 2008. This extension of time is consistent with the extension of time granted to Respondent in which to file exceptions.

In addition, Counsel for General Counsel respectfully requests permission to exceed the page limit set forth in Section 102.46(j) of the Board's Rules and Regulations. On March 21, 2008, the Board granted Respondent permission to exceed the page limit for its Brief in Support of Exceptions, not to exceed 100 pages. As set forth above, Respondent's Brief in Support of Exceptions is 100 pages. Counsel for General Counsel respectfully requests permission to submit a Brief in Support of Exceptions not to exceed 100 pages.
