**UNOPPOSED FIRST REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE EXCEPTIONS
AND SUPPORTING BRIEF**

Respondent Quicken Loans Inc. (“Quicken Loans”), by and through its counsel and pursuant to Section 102.46(a) of the Rules and Regulations of the National Labor Relations Board (“Rules and Regulations”), respectfully requests that the Board extend the parties’ time to file exceptions and supporting briefs in the above-captioned case by 14 days. This is the first request for an extension. Counsel for the Acting General Counsel and the Charging Party Lydia E. Garza do not oppose Quicken Loans’ requested extension.

The Complaint in this matter was issued on September 14, 2012. On November 13, 2012, Administrative Law Judge Joel P. Biblowitz conducted a hearing in Phoenix, Arizona. On January 8, 2013, ALJ Biblowitz issued a Decision and the Board entered an order transferring this case to the Board. Pursuant to Section 102.46(a) of the Rules and Regulations, the parties’ exceptions and supporting briefs currently must be filed with the Board by February 5, 2013. Quicken Loans seeks to extend the parties’ time to file exceptions and supporting briefs by 14 days, through and including February 19, 2013.

Quicken Loans was represented solely by Littler Mendelson, P.C. in connection with the Complaint and the hearing before ALJ Biblowitz. Quicken Loans' counsel Honigman Miller Schwartz and Cohn LLP has now entered an appearance as co-counsel in this matter. A 14-day extension of the parties' time to file exceptions and supporting briefs would enable Quicken Loans' counsel to thoroughly review the record and fully consider appropriate exceptions to the ALJ's rulings during the hearing and in the Decision. There would be no prejudice as a result of a short, 14-day extension.

For the foregoing reasons, Quicken Loans respectfully requests that the Board extend the parties' time to file exceptions and supporting briefs by 14 days, through and including **February 19, 2013**.
